We sitting on beds in Amy and Deney's room, enjoying our yogurt from Nacumat, and it is fairly cool as it has now rained most of the afternoon. We decided to get food to take to our rooms since it takes so long to order dinner at the conference center and we also had a feast at Pastor Philip's home.

His home was mud, like adobe, with a metal roof. The living room/eating area was quite long and they had the puffy chairs

1. 01-21-13 Meru Women's Prison
2. 01-21-13 Meru Men's Prison – small courtyard, walked around corner and men in front row
3. 01-23-13 Kitale Men's Prison – Kipsongut
4. 01-23-13 Kitale Women's Prison – 2 women gave their testimony – hot small courtyard
5. 01-26-13 Kisumu – Kibos – Chaplain Silas – Disciples up on hill, principal at the desk (he had glasses & shoes) – very hot – Chaplain Nancy went with us too
6. 01-27-13 Kisumu – Kodiaga – Chaplain Nancy & Male prison Chaplain as interpreter – best animals & badminton net
7. 01-27-13 Kisumu – Kodiaga Men's Prison – man in back singing Alleluia and gently led away
8. 01-28-13 Kisii Men's Prison – ¾ roof and then it started raining – men in outer courtyard were led in to join us – Warden who had "Chicken Soup for the Prisoner's Soul" – Said "we were his friends to the female warden"
9. 01-28-13 Kisii Women's Prison – beautiful manicured topiary – rain & inside industry building (crocheting, embroidery)
10. 01-29-13 Migori Men's Prison – near Tanzania – were outside in sun – Chaplain Peter – very tall – talked about prisoners from other countries – He said that prisoners were lucky to get there (we think meaning they weren't killed prior to getting to prison.) He also mentioned that stoning was fairly common.
11. 01-29-13 Migori Women's Prison – covered patio – women looked so sad – covered area – Chaplain Marie said, "Criminals are not born" – Asked ladies at first if they had given their lives to Christ – only 2 hands had gone up – by the time we were finished all ladies were smiling and when the Chaplain asked if they had given their lives to Christ they all raised their hands

12. 01-29-13 Homa Bay - Men & Women's prisoners combined – it had rained earlier so it was great to be under the large covered area – men's group sang first for us and then the women's group sang for everyone too
